The Gospel of St John.

While Year B of the Lectionary, we normally read the Gospel of St Mark on the Sundays of Ordinary time, the Gospel of St John is read from the 17th Sunday to the 21st Sunday inclusive. These readings focus upon Chapter 6 of his Gospel, and relate to St John's discussion of the Eucharist—the Bread of Life.

John presents Jesus as the divine Son of God who enters our earthly creation and ascends to God again when his mission is complete. John reveals a strong image of Jesus who is totally in control. John refers to him as the "Word" or the "Light" who existed with the Father from all enternity and with whom the Father created the World.

The Gospel of St John is basically divided into two sections—the Book of Signs (1:19—12:50) and the Book of Glory (13:1—20:31). The Gospel begins with the Prologue that is hymn about Christ; described in terms of the Word, and the Light. "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God … In him was life, and he life was the light of men …" The prologue also introduces John the Baptist and his witness to Christ.

In this Gospel, John uses contrasting ideas or opposites. He speaks about light and darkness, heaven and earth, life and death, Spirit and flesh, God and Satan and so on. He frequently contrasts this world and its ways with those of Heaven.

From the second chapter onwards, John recounts the first of the signs of Jesus at the wedding in Cana and follows with incidents that continue to highlight the role of Jesus as the Word made flesh. A highlight of these chapters is his dioscourse with the woman at the well concerning the water of eternal life and the place of true worship.

In chapters 5 to 10, John speaks of the conflict of Jesus with those who misunderstand the meaning of the Sabbath. Jesus teaches about the Sabbath and performs healing on this day of rest. He highlights his relationship to God the Father, feeds the crowd in the desert, walks on water and gives a discourse on the bread of Life. The passion and cross become the dominant themes in chapters 11 and 12 and the Book of Signs ends with a discusson on the message of the cross.
