He is also challenging us to make the best possible use of what has been given to each of us. It is not important what our gift is but what we do with what we have. While we may not be blessed with musical, sporting or artistic talents, nevertheless, we are all more than capable of making a difference in the lives of others. We can do this in a wide variety of ways; by the love, care and generosity of spirit we share with our family; with the energy and enthusiasm, nay passion, we bring to our work. We do it by taking a genuine interest in others, spending time with them, listening attentively to their concerns, encouraging them in often small but significant ways. It is uplifting to know that some of the most anonymous, apparently insignificant people are making headlines in heaven.

Sadly, some people never come to realise or make use of the gifts they are blessed with. They are good and decent people who prefer to sit on the sideline as the world just seems to pass them by. They adopt a very cautious approach and it is this cautious approach that Jesus is critical of in our gospel. It reminds me of the a paraphrase of a well known poem that goes as follows:

> There was a very cautious man who never laughed or played. He never risked, he never tried, he never sang or prayed. And when one day he passed away, his insurance was denied. For since he never really lived, they claim he never died.

As God's beloved children, we are invited not to bury our 'talent' in the ground but to make the best possible use of our individual gifts. This will enable us to live joyfully and attain our sense of personal fulfilment.
