### 26<sup>th</sup> Sunday B.

In the second reading from St. James today we hear of a condemnation of the rich who exploit the weak. This theme carries on to the Gospel where Jesus has harsh words for anyone who would try to bring down 'the little ones'. As we approach the end of the annual celebration of the Season of Creation let today's Gospel be a call to care for the weak and vulnerable.

Through our exploitation of the earth's goods it is the poorest of the world who suffer. Let us always be conscious of our responsibility to be stewards of creation, to connect more deeply with the wondrous world around us, to take action against all that threatens our natural environment.

"God of love, show us our place in this world as channels of your love for all the creatures of this earth, for not one of them is forgotten in your sight. Enlighten those who possess power and money that they may avoid the sin of indifference, that they may love the common good, advance the weak, and care for this world in which we live. The poor and the earth are crying out." (Laudato Si, 245).

# 27<sup>th</sup> September: St Vincent de Paul.

Born near Dax in France in 1581. As a young priest he was captured by Moorish pirates who carried him to Africa. He was sold into slavery, but freed in 1607 when he converted his owner. Having returned to France, he became successively a parish priest and chaplain to the galley-slaves. He founded a religious Congregation now known as Vincentians, to undertake the apostolic work of charity; he sent them to preach missions, and to establish seminaries.

St. Vincent worked tirelessly to help those in need: the impoverished, the sick, the enslaved, the abandoned, the ignored. He died in Paris on 27<sup>th</sup> September 1660. He is the patron saint of works of charity, some of whom are grouped together as the 'Vincentian family', of which the best known is probably the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul, working in over 140 countries.

O God, who for the relief of the poor and the formation of the clergy endowed the priest Saint Vincent de Paul with apostolic virtues, grant, we pray, that, afire with that same spirit, we may love what he loved and put into practice what he taught.
