1st Sunday of Advent, year C.

The word 'Advent' means 'coming', 'arriving'. During the Advent season, we tend to focus on Jesus' first coming, at his birth in the land of Israel some two thousand years ago. However, the readings for this Sunday also point us toward Jesus' Second Coming and the fullness of God's kingdom that this will herald. These readings prompt us to reflect on what is the goal of Christian hope: eternal life with God through Jesus Christ.

Between the two comings of Jesus, St Paul calls on us to try to increase our love and holiness, so that we 'may be blameless in the sight of God when Jesus comes with all his saints'.

With the First Sunday of Advent, we begin a new Church Year, Year C, the year of Luke's Gospel. The Advent wreath is present in the Sanctuary of our churches. Formed in a circle, an ancient symbol of God who has neither beginning nor end, the wreath proclaims life in the midst of the seeming death of winter. Its candles proclaim that Christ, whose Second Coming we Christians await with hope, is the light that no darkness can overcome. With each week of Advent we light one more candle and the darkness retreats a bit further.

This is to help the Church recall just what and who it is for which we wait during this season of Advent: the kingdom of God in its fullness and the coming of the One who will banish all darkness for ever.

'May the increasing light of these candles brighten our minds and hearts to be steadfast in faith, joyful in hope and untiring in hope, so that we are ready again to receive in true peace, Jesus, the Light of the World.' (*Book of Blessing Prayers*).
