"You put aside the commandment of God to cling to human traditions." The word 'tradition' can sometimes be used in a negative sense: as a reluctance to engage with changed or existing circumstances or a form of nostalgia for a past age. Yet, tradition involves handing on what we have received, for example our faith and faith practices that we have received from God. So there is sense that things cannot change—the great foundational truths of the Christian faith.

Still, in every generation these truths are received in a different context, human society changes in differing ways, language mutates, and issues that were unimaginable in the past have become pressing realities of our present day. That is the great work of the people of God: to listen to God's word to understand and to contemplate its implications in the context of the present day and the existing environment. St Paul tells us that "*The word of God is something alive and active*" (Heb. 4:12). St. John Henry Newman also maintained that "*To live is to change, and to be perfect is to have changed often.*" The Church—with means each one of us—has the responsibility of handing on the treasure we have been given—not our own 'human tradition' but the faith that has been planted in us. This is the Living Word that endures beyond all ages and so applies and lived out in the context of ages past.
