NOVEMBER: A TIME TO REMEMBER.

Each year, our church in its wisdom, sets aside the month of November as that special time in our year when we are asked to remember and pray for all our departed loved ones. It is a time of year when nature itself is preaching its own silent sermon about the end of things. The trees are almost bare, the weather is getting colder, the nights are long and most growth has ceased. As another year in our lives is drawing to a close we reflect on the changes that have taken place in our lives. We are also mindful that the Covid pandemic has had a major impact on all of us and perhaps changed the way we view our lives and what we now regard as most precious for us. For some of the families in our parish it is sadly the loss of a loved one that impinges most.

When we remember our dear departed loved ones, especially in November, their names, personalities and stories live on. We continue to cherish the great gift of who they were and continue to be in our lives. We all have our own individual ways of keeping those memories alive. For some, it is by visiting a grave to say a silent prayer or place fresh flowers. For others, it is writing their name on a list of our dead in our 4 churches; the lighting of a candle, glancing at a photograph on a mantelpiece; a few quiet moments in prayer or thanksgiving as memories of happier times come flooding back; the shedding of tears when no one can see. All those memories are part and parcel of the broad landscape of our lives. In our 'remembering', we draw comfort and consolation in the fulsome belief that our loved ones still live on beyond the confines of the grave. In the words of the book of Wisdom: **"they are in the loving embrace of God and no torment shall ever touch them"**.

As we place our 'Remembrance Tree', in our Sanctuary in St. Mary's Church, for November 2021, we do so to honour those from our parish community who have died over the past year. We will also be inviting their families to our **'November Mass' in St. Mary's Church on Friday 26th November at 8pm.**
